

All our events are placed on our school calendar and school website. In addition, communication of the events is sent out via the School Status platform, website, social media, weekly newsletters and Blackboard Connect. Newsletters and phone calls are sent home weekly by the staff. Signs, flyers, and posters will also be utilized around campus and sent home. Parent and family engagement activities will occur at various times throughout the day to ensure that a time frame is available for all parents/guardians to attend around their personal schedule. All family members are welcome to our monthly events. On occasion, games and activities are provided for children while the event takes place. If a parent/guardian has any issue with attending or understanding an event, office personnel are always available to answer any questions. We also plan to visit the community on certain events.

Teachers will send home a weekly newsletter and a weekly phone call or text message highlighting all upcoming events. These are also available via social media. In addition, the principal will make Sunday calls and send home communications. We have different activities on campus throughout the year to provide additional outlets of information for our stakeholders. Staff are prepared to aid parents in comprehension on campus.

Weekly newsletters are provided to families that include information about resources provided to improve student learning.
